### **DIRECTOR'S NOTE**



In his introduction to the play, LaBute discusses the "power of limitations". He highlights the physical claustrophobia of a car that increases drama, both positively and negatively. My little purple hatchback has certainly been that. It cradled me as I drove back and forth to Illinois to be with family and it moved me from an apartment to a condo to a house filled to the

brim with all my belongings. It carried me to and from work and play, and has been host to the greatest of conversations and fights. All these dreams, tears, and words, held within the glass and metal confines.

This power of limitations fits in a theatrical sense as well. Theatre depends on the suspension of disbelief from its audience; the willingness to accept forced perspective, ceilingless rooms, cars and couches built out of nothing but chairs, and overall artificiality in a way we hardly accept on film. We arrive in a theatre (or these days on a livestream) ready to imagine and fill in the blanks around what the text and design offers us. Hungry to do so even. The original production of this play was a one night only benefit done simply as a reading in chairs. The playwright trusts the audience to piece together everything else they need to imagine the world. There's also something about a show like this with so little tech that allows for the freedom to engage with the text in an incredibly satisfying way, and this rehearsal process has been so stimulating.

It is just those limitations that drove me (get it?!) to choose this play for the MMAS season. Why reinvent a different show when this one fits so nicely into the limits and restrictions of the times? We took on the challenge of seeking real life couples for the scenes that required contact and designing glass shields between solo actors paired together in other scenes. The incredible production team took on new challenges and reevaluated plans as the COVID landscape shifted. And what started as a conversation in July 2020, appears before you today on your screens thanks to the dedication and commitment of this amazing organization. Thanks Dori and Ken for seeing past the limitations and allowing me to enter the (virtual) rehearsal room again. I can't tell you how badly I needed it.

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### About the Mass Music and Arts Society

A quarter century ago, eight friends formed a non-profit (501 (c)(3)) organization to support the arts and artists. Today, their brainstorm has grown into a thriving arts organization – the Mass Music & Arts Society, Black Box Theater & Morini Gallery (MMAS) – recognized throughout Southeastern Massachusetts.

With an annual operating budget of just over \$500,000, MMAS attracts about 10,000 audience members, patrons and performers from New Hampshire to Rhode Island and Cape Cod. Audiences come to MMAS because they know they will see exceptional productions in the intimate 76-seat Black Box Theater for a fraction of the cost of a ticket in Boston or Providence. MMAS is also home to the Morini Art Gallery which offers exhibitions of works by local and regional artists. The recent addition of the MMAS Arts Academy motivates learners ages 4+, of all abilities, interests, and incomes to participate in our comprehensive performing arts programs and experience the transformative life skills that creative engagement inspires.

The Mansfield Music & Arts Society recently signed an agreement to own 888 South Main St. across from the Xfinity Center. A 250-seat theater and art gallery on three acres on the Norton Reservoir is the vision of the new Arts Center at Great Woods. The nonprofit arts organization plans to renovate and expand the site to continue offering its theatrical productions, exhibits, arts classes and musical performances.

MMAS is a volunteer organization; our actors, and technicians are all volunteers; as is everyone who works the ticket office and concession area for every performance. Each year, volunteers give almost 30,000 hours to MMAS.
