Farce has a long tradition of being the theater's playground, where laughter and chaos abound. Since the days of ancient Greek and Roman comedy, through the door-slamming antics of Molière and the razor-sharp wit of Noël Coward, farce has relied on misunderstandings, mistaken identities, and heightened physicality to delight audiences. The genre thrives on speed, exaggeration, and the delicious thrill of watching characters unravel in impossible situations.

Sandy Rustin's *The Cottage* embraces this rich tradition while daring to take it one step further. Set in 1923 in the English countryside, the play begins as a classic farce—with secrets, affairs, and unexpected visitors piling up at an alarming rate. But Rustin's voice is distinctly modern. Beneath the sharp banter and absurd reveals, she infuses the play with a modern, feminist sensibility, asking what happens when women stop playing by the old rules.

The result is both homage and reinvention: a comedy that revels in the sheer fun of farce while slyly dismantling its conventions. Where classic farce often left women as pawns in men's schemes, *The Cottage* allows its female characters to seize the stage, the story, and ultimately, their own futures rich with possibilities.

While directing this production, my goal has been to honor the madcap tradition of farce while also highlighting Rustin's timely undercurrent—the idea that laughter can be a powerful form of rebellion. As the lights dim and the Victrola starts to turn, you are invited to sit back, lean into the absurdity, and enjoy your stay at *The Cottage*.

On a personal note, I wish to express my profound gratitude to Ken Butler, Dori Bryan-Ployer, and the rest of the superb Mass Arts Center production team for this wonderful opportunity and their steadfast support. To my friends, Nick and Rich, thank you for joining me on this wild adventure. And to the tremendously talented Andrew, Christian, Elizabeth, Greg, Margaret, Stephanie and Will—there are no words to express the admiration I have for you as both artists and people. About the Mass Arts Center

The Mass Arts Center (formerly MMAS) provides a cultural home for artists, audiences, and aspiring performers of all ages. At our core is a rich schedule of theater productions, performing arts education, art exhibits, and live entertainment. The synergy of these offerings honors individual artistic interests through diverse creative opportunities.

In 1993, eight friends formed a non-profit (501 (c)(3)) organization known as The Mansfield Music and Arts Society (MMAS) to support the arts and artists. Today, the organization is known as The Mass Arts Center and operates at 888 South Main Street with three branches of the organization: The Reservoir Stage, the Morini Art Gallery, and The Academy at Mass Arts. The organization seeks to provide a wide array of education, programs, performances, and opportunities for both aspiring and experienced performers, artists, and patrons from across the region.

Audiences come to The Mass Arts Center because they know they will see exceptional productions in the newly renovated 100-seat house of the Reservoir Stage for a fraction of the cost of a ticket in Boston or Providence. The Mass Arts Center is also home to the Morini Art Gallery which offers exhibitions of works by local and regional artists. The Academy at Mass Arts is the educational branch that offers a variety of classes and education programs for all ages.

The Mass Arts Center is a volunteer organization. Our actors, and technicians are all volunteers, as well as everyone who works the ticket office and concession area for every performance. Each year, volunteers give almost 30,000 hours to ensure its success.
